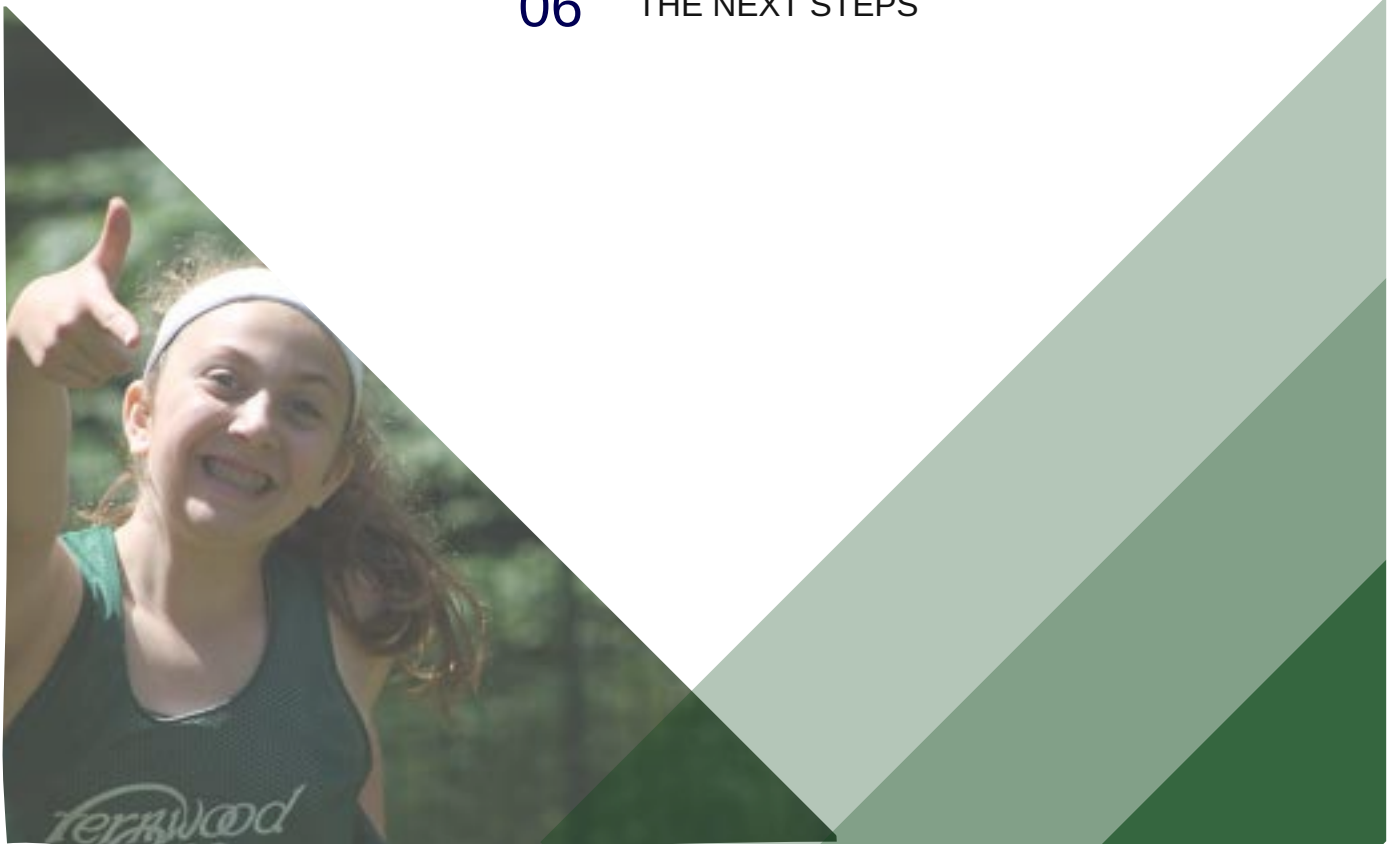

Who we are





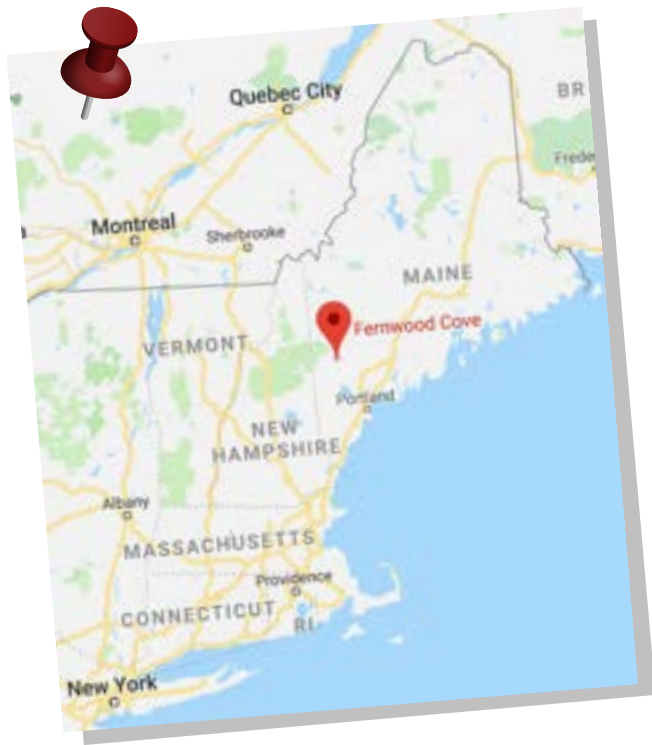
Fernwood Cove Directors

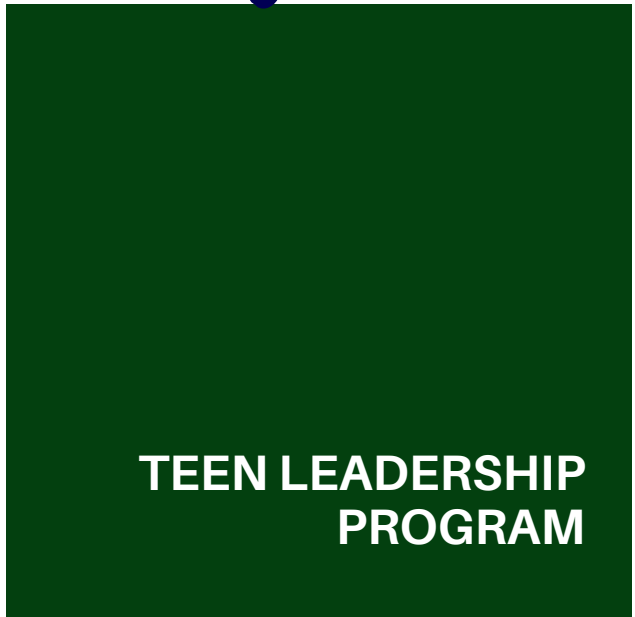


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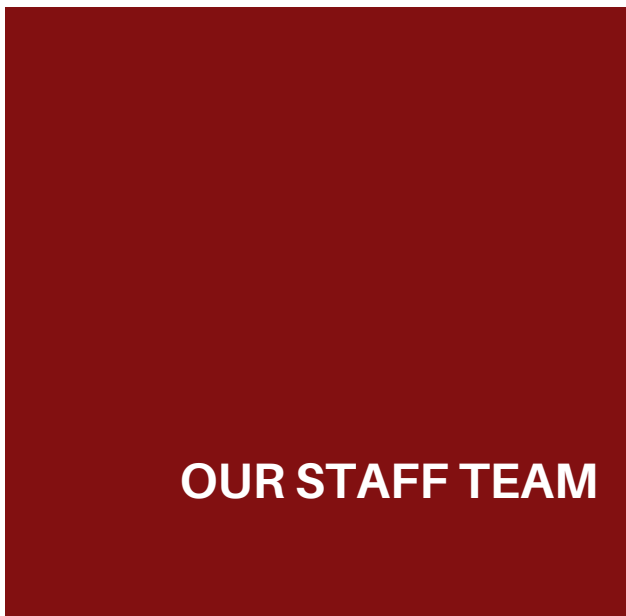

Fernwood Cove Campers

Fernwood Cove campers are girls ages 7-15 from throughout the United States and around the world. Campers attend one of our two three and a half week sessions, often returning to the same session for the entirety of their camper summers. Fernwood Cove camper uniform is hunter/forest green bottoms and white shirts.



Teen Leadership Program

Fernwood Cove girls who have aged out of the camper program can apply to participate in our Teen Leadership Program. First as Counselors In Training (CITs) former campers develop valuable health and safety, leadership and activity based skills. Upon successful completion of the CIT summer, girls are eligible to apply to become Junior Counselors, where they have greater responsibilities throughout the camp program and continue leadership skill development. CITs and Junior Counselors wear maroon bottoms and white shirts.



Our Staff Team

Fernwood Cove staff come from around the world and work as either Counselors or Support Staff. Fernwood Cove Counselors are specialist instructors who teach one or more activities.

They are also bunk counselors, overseeing all aspects of bunk life throughout the camp session. Support Staff work in either the Healthcare, Kitchen, Housekeeping, or Maintenance departments. Support Staff are key to the overall success of camp operations.

All Fernwood Cove staff wear navy bottoms and white shirts.

The relationships developed at camp are unique. The magic of camp creates bonds that last long past summer.



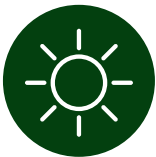

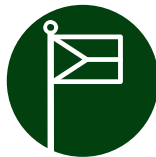

Half-Season Traditional Camp for Girls

Thoughts of summer camp often bring visions of happy friends, loads of silly songs, campfires, and many different activities. Fernwood Cove is that and so much more. Our half-season traditional program offers all of the experiences of a full-summer program in a convenient three and a half week summer.

Fernwood Cove campers can participate in over 60 different activities, enjoy Trip Day adventures, cheer for their team in our Green & White Games and roast many, many marshmallows! Our intentional program empowers Fernwood Cove campers to grow in ways that aren't often available at school, on sports teams, or at home.

Juniors

The second oldest age group of campers, Juniors (8th grade) are growing leaders within the camper community. Living in a single, large bunk allows the girls to bond on a deeper level.

Working together to organize Services and coordinate Banquet at the end of the camp session are capstones of the Juniors' experience.

Seniors

The oldest campers at Fernwood Cove, the Seniors, have just completed 9th grade. Most of these girls have multiple summers at camp and exude Fernwood Cove enthusiasm. They are leaders within the camp community, leading daily assembly and coordinating special events. They live in Flamingo bunk and love everything pink!

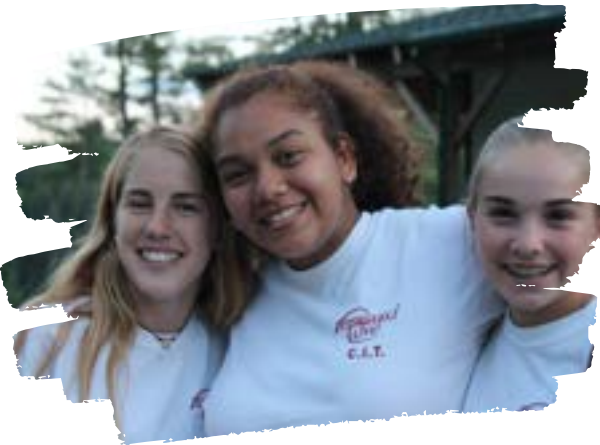


Teen Leadership Development



The Fernwood Cove Teen Leadership Development Program provides a hands-on, immersive experience for Fernwood Cove girls who have aged out of the camper program.

Girls in the Teen Leadership Programs develop valuable life skills including leadership, organization, and time management as they assist in activities, help with bunk life and assist in leading evening programs, trips, and special events. CITs and Junior Counselors are a valuable resource for counselors due to their understanding of Fernwood Cove programs, values, and community.



Counselors In Training

Counselors In Training (CITs) develop key leadership skills as well as valuable skills in health and safety and activity instruction skills.

Daily curriculum supports through growth and provides guidance from highly experience counselors who coordinate and lead the CIT Program.



The CIT Program brings former Fernwood Cove campers from both sessions together in a full-summer program. CITs are chosen through an application process and limited positions are available.

Junior Counselors

Upon completion of the CIT Summer, Fernwood Cove girls can apply to be Junior Counselors.

This new Fernwood Cove program provides past CITs the opportunity of continued growth with greater levels of responsibility, particularly focused on bunk counselor roles and responsibilities. Again, Junior Counselors are chosen through an application process, for the full-summer program.

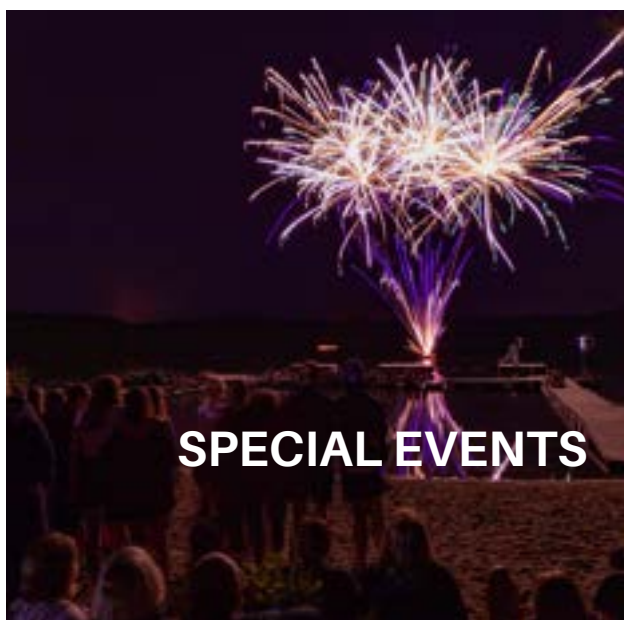

Fernwood Cove's instructional activities are called Focus Activities. With over 60 individual activity options offered each week, Fernwood Cove girls have endless opportunities to experience new activities. Our "choice with structure" program allows Fernwood Cove girls to choose their weekly activities while including required activities and activity categories. Activity requirements decrease as campers age, allowing greater freedom of activity choices for older campers.

Fernwood Cove counselors provide quality skill development to campers of all ages and abilities. Individualized instruction ensures every Fernwood Cove girl develops new skills through fun and engaging activities.

Evening Programs

Each night the Fernwood Cove community enjoys an Evening Program. Most programs are all-camp events, with some programs occurring weekly. Other programs are organized by bunk or age group providing the opportunity to build closer bonds with bunkmates and friends.

Fernwood Cove Counselors lead Evening Programs throughout the camp session. There are a multitude of opportunities to help plan and facilitate Evening Programs. These are a great way to develop communication and group leadership skills!



Special Event Days

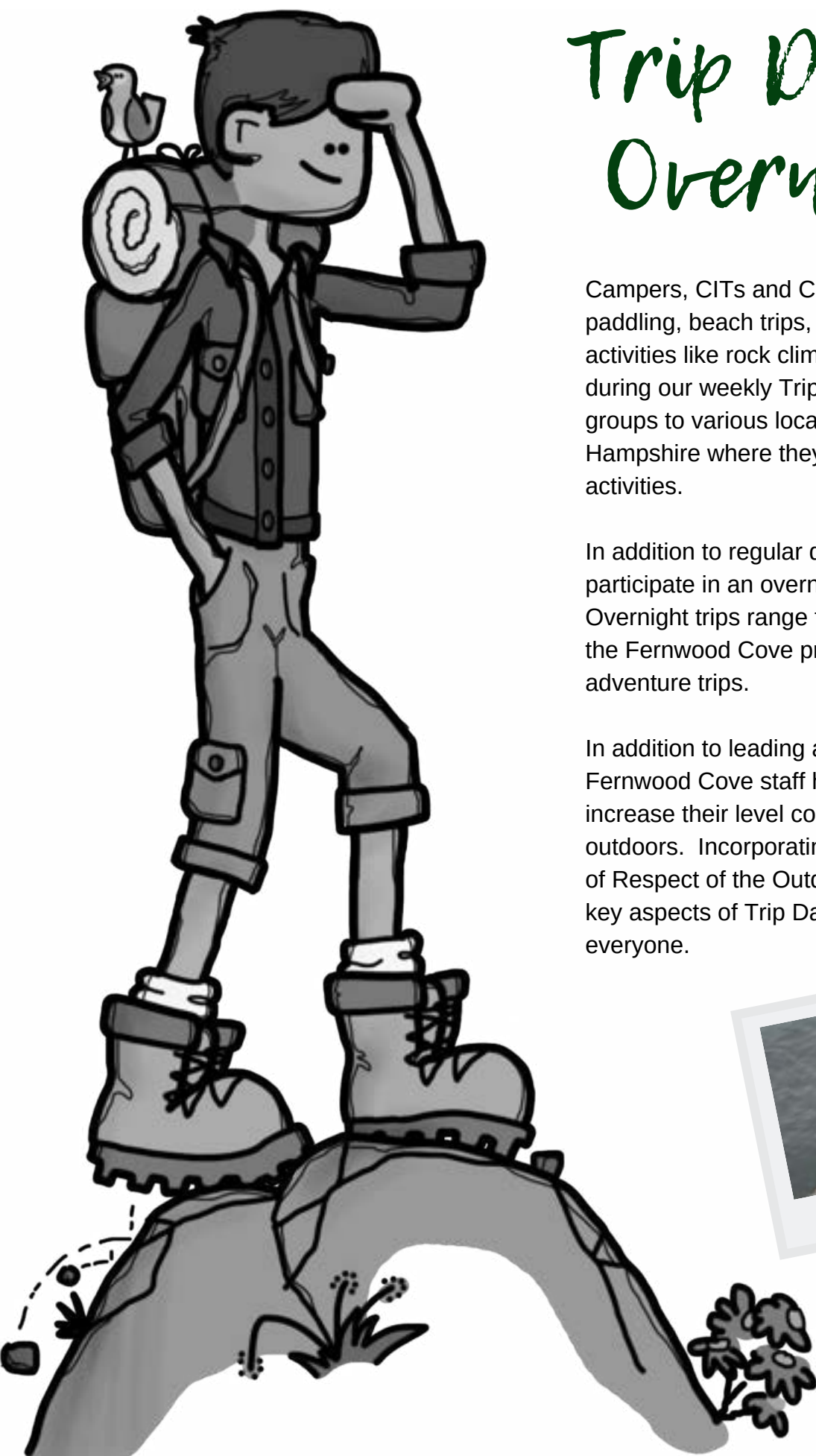
SERVICES

Weekly services are organized by 7th, 8th, and 9th grade campers and focus on various ethical topics related to Fernwood Cove values. This is a special time where campers express their love of camp and understanding of Fernwood Cove values in their lives.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Special Events like Carnival and Color War occur during the afternoon. Counselors help lead activities that are organized by older campers and CITs. These events are full of fun and memories.





Trip Days & Overnights

Campers, CITs and Counselors enjoy hiking, paddling, beach trips, and outdoor adventure activities like rock climbing and whitewater rafting during our weekly Trip Days. Staff lead small trip groups to various locations in Maine and New Hampshire where they participate in various outdoor activities.

In addition to regular day trips, all campers participate in an overnight camping trip during camp. Overnight trips range from camping at campsites on the Fernwood Cove property to backpacking adventure trips.

In addition to leading all aspects of out of camp trips, Fernwood Cove staff help empower campers to increase their level comfort and knowledge of the outdoors. Incorporating the Fernwood Cove values of Respect of the Outdoors and Personal Growth are key aspects of Trip Days and Overnights for everyone.

Living & Working at Camp



Camp is A Real Job



FOUNDATION EXPECTATIONS

Working at camp is fun. Working at camp brings many adventures. Working at camp is a real job. And likely one of the hardest and most important jobs you could ever have. The care and development of Fernwood Cove campers is a large responsibility. Fernwood Cove staff need to be prepared to meet established expectations regarding professionalism, positive leadership, inclusion, and personal growth.

CAMP COUNSELORS

Fernwood Cove counselors are responsible for all aspects of the Fernwood Cove program.

Counselors are both bunk counselors and activity instructors. Counselors can also expect additional responsibilities related to leading Evening Programs, Special Events, Trip Days and Overnights. Fernwood Cove counselors work in a variety of team atmospheres allowing them to connect and work with people throughout the camp community.



SUPPORT STAFF

The Fernwood Cove Support Staff are critical for the overall success of camp. Working in the Kitchen, Maintenance and Housekeeping departments, our support staff are responsible for a variety of tasks around camp.



HEALTHCARE STAFF

The Fernwood Cove Healthcare Team is comprised of Registered Nurses and additional healthcare professionals. They work to ensure all members of the Fernwood Cove community are healthy and provide regular healthcare services to all members of the camp community.



Living at Camp

Fernwood Cove staff are housed in cabins that are centrally located in camp. Female counselors live with campers in traditional cabins.

Following the value of Simple Living, Fernwood Cove camper bunks do not have electricity. Bath houses with shower and toilet facilities are nearby. There is a minimum of two bunk counselors per camper bunk.

Support Staff and Male Counselors live in similar cabins in the Staff Village. Staff Village bunks have electricity- with overhead lights and electrical outlets in the bunks. Shared, single-gender shower houses are nearby.

Bunks are equipped with bunk beds and have basic storage spaces for personal items.

Bunks typically sleep 8-12 people and staff are responsible for the upkeep and cleanliness of their bunks. Community living helps campers and staff to build strong relationships and friendships.

Time Off

Work schedules and time off vary among the various staff positions at camp. All staff can expect regular time off throughout the summer.

Early Evenings and Days off are the perfect time to explore nearby Maine and New Hampshire. Popular destinations include Portland, Maine and North Conway, New Hampshire

Staff can enjoy outdoor activities and experiences such as lighthouse tours or baseball games in Portland. Shopping, hiking, and local restaurants are a favorite in North Conway.

Staff have access to camp vehicles to enjoy the various nearby locations. And you're always welcome to remain in camp to rest, relax and enjoy the camp day.

The Interview



The interview helps us learn more about you, but it's also a time for you to learn more about Fernwood Cove and working at camp.

What to expect from a Fernwood Cove interview:

- a video call with a Fernwood Cove Director
- questions regarding your past experiences and how they are applicable to your success working at Fernwood Cove
- scenario-based discussion that focuses on childcare, youth development, teamwork, and living in a global community
- the opportunity to ask questions and clarify information in this packet and items discussed during the interview

Reference Checks



Reference Checks are required for all new applicants and must be submitted for an offer of employment. References must be non-familial adults who know you in a professional, civic, or academic role. Please inform anyone you've included as a reference that you've submitted an application to Fernwood Cove. They can expect an email from Fernwood Cove including information for an online reference form.

*Note that international applicants who have provided references for their J1 visa agency are not required to provide separate references.

Background Check



A national level background check is required for all American applicants. A police check is required for all international J1 visa applicants and must be submitted to your visa agency as a part of the J1 visa application. A background/police check is required annually.

Additional driver record checks are conducted for anyone eligible to be a camp driver or operate camp vehicles.
